Area Letter for April 2024, from one of the Area Staff Team.

One of my earliest childhood recollections is standing on the front doorstep with mother as we waited for the bus to take my brother off to school. As I stood there a young Jean Sargeant shouted across the road to me saying that I had dropped my handkerchief and, as I looked on the ground for it, she gleefully added 'April Fool!' Yes, it's April and the month begins with light-hearted jest — and some slight embarrassment for those caught out. With humour being in short supply at the moment, maybe a little laughter wouldn't hurt.

Looking at the lectionary for the month, I was mindful that the Sunday after Easter was traditionally referred to as Low Sunday; possibly because of the contrast with the high celebration of Easter Day, or even because congregation numbers were typically lower. Another theory is that 'Low' was simply a corruption of the word 'Laudes' meaning praise. Whatever the reason, the name seems to have disappeared from common use. In fact, a couple of years ago I discovered a new name for this particular Sunday... Holy Humour Sunday or Laughter Sunday.

With much going on in the world that is very unsettling, it's no wonder that people are becoming disillusioned. Disillusioned with world powers and leaders, disillusioned with politics, even disillusioned with the weather! During that first Easter week the disciples were afraid, and locked themselves in the room where they stayed. Not only were they fearful, but they would also have been disillusioned, and probably hurting from all that they had lost. We cannot fully imagine the immense joy they experienced when the risen Christ burst into their places of darkness. For them this was the start of something wonderfully new which gained momentum through this feeling of joy.

Most of us would agree that joy and laughter are important things, yet many people experience worship in churches where laughter and even the sound of children is still frowned upon. For some reason, many have equated devout religion with solemnity, which is rather sad. Joy and laughter can lead us to healing. Sometimes God's grace comes to us in the form of humour that helps us make it through another day. Recognising that humour is a characteristic of the divine nature helps us deepen our understanding of the nature of God; remembering that God laughs at us and with us — and that laughter is an expression of God's love and acceptance.

May we all be so infected with the joy of this Eastertide, that both our fellowship and our secular lives will reflect that love and acceptance that

God desires, and that we can overcome disillusionment with laughter – even if we just laugh at ourselves.

So, I leave you with this...

A vicar requested quotes from local painters to redecorate the exterior of the parish hall. All the quotes were within a few pounds of one another, except for one by a parishioner who had been in business for years and had an excellent reputation in the community. His quote was about half of his competitors, so naturally the vicar gave him the job. On the day he was to begin, the painter realised that he had miscalculated badly. Not wanting to lose face and the job, he decided to add water to the paint to make it go further. A week later he received a phone call from the vicar, complaining that after recent rain half the paint had washed off. Feeling a sense of guilt, the painter went inside the church to pray about his dilemma, knowing that his business reputation was on the line. "What can I possibly do, Lord?" prayed the disheartened painter. In a loud voice God replied, "Repaint! Repaint and thin no more!"

DIGGING INTO THE PAST - 1952 (part 2)

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

A Parochial Church Council was held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday Sept 3rd 1952 at 7.30.

Apologies were received from Mrs McCann, Mr Lander, Mr Potter.

Those present: Mr & Mrs J H Statham, Mr & Mrs Cart, Mr & Mrs Searle, Mr & Mrs E J Whittaker, Mr R Whittaker, Mr & Mrs G Talbot, Mrs Goodwin, Mrs Corbishley, Mr Steele, Mr Thornton Ward, Mr Sargeant, Mr & Mrs D B Torrance.

The Vicar (The Rev M C Clarke) presided and opened the meeting with prayers.

Minutes - The minutes of the previous meeting held on May 21^{st} were read and approved.

Vestry Walls - As regards the repairs to the vestry walls; it was reported that it was caused by the water leaking through the roof. It was proposed by Mr J H Statham and seconded by Mr Searle and carried that Messrs Ward & Godbehere Ltd send in an estimate for the repair of half the roof, the vestry walls and church door; and that the Vicar and Churchwardens be given power to act.

Lichfield Diocesan Branch of Finance - A letter was received from Major Foster, Secretary to the Lichfield Diocesan Branch of Finance, asking for help to bring all the stipends of the incumbents up to the minimum standards. It was proposed by Mr Whittaker seconded by Mr G Talbot and carried that a sum of £4 be sent, in addition to the Quota.

Sunday School - It was proposed by Mrs G Talbot and seconded by Mrs D B Torrance and carried that the sum of £5 be given to the Sunday School funds.

Harvest Festival - The Vicar reported that the preachers for the harvest Festival had been arranged.

Belfry Beams - It was proposed that the beams in the Belfry be inspected by Messrs Ward on the proposition of Mr H J Statham and seconded by Mrs G Talbot and carried.

There being no other business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers.

PCC meeting Nov 26th 1952. The meeting was opened with prayer at 7.30pm by the Vicar.

Apologies were received from Mrs H J Statham.

Those present: The Vicar Rev M C Clarke, Mr J H Statham, Mrs Ward, Mr Potter, Mr & Mrs Cart, Mr & Mrs Searle, Mr & Mrs E J Whittaker, Mr R Whittaker, Mr & Mrs G Talbot, Mrs Goodwin, Mrs Corbishley, Mr Thornton Ward, Mr J Sargeant, Mr & Mrs D B Torrance, Mr S. Lander, Mr B Bloor, Mr A Bloor and Mr Dawes.

Letter from the Bishop - The Vicar read a letter from the Bishop re the year of lay witness with suggestions for the forthcoming year.

Service before PCC meetings: It was proposed by Mrs E Whittaker and seconded by Mr H Statham and carried that a short service be held in church before the PCC meetings at 7.15pm. It was also agreed that special prayers be read. Also that the Vice Chairman, Mr Searle, should revise the Electoral Roll.

Beams in the Belfry - Messrs Ward & Godbehere reported that the beams in the Belfry were not in a very bad state and that the damage to the roof caused by the recent gale had been repaired. They were instructed to repair the lead on the roof as soon as possible; also the gutters.

Armistice Day - It was proposed by Mr G Talbot and seconded by Mrs Talbot and carried that the sum of £2.2.0 be sent from the collections on Armistice Day to Carl Haig's Poppy Day Fund.

Trinity Sunday - It was proposed by Mrs G. Talbot and seconded by Mrs Torrance and carried that the church collections on Trinity Sunday be sent to the Ordination Funds, that the Harvest Festival collections be divided between the S P G, the Royal Agric. Benevolent Fund and the Mission to Seamen. The work of the S.P.C.K. was explained by the Vicar.

Welcome - A hearty welcome was awarded to Mr Dawes.

Vicar's Report - The Vicar in his report thanked everyone for the loyal support and how sorry they were to lose Mr Taylor and wished him every blessing in his new Parish. He hoped that by September he would be able to appoint a deacon but in the meantime assistance would be very difficult to obtain so that the next six months was not very bright. He explained the difficulty of obtaining staff.

There being no other business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers.

Next meeting Wed. January 21st 1953 7.30pm preceded by prayers in church at 7.15pm.

Penny's Recipe of the Month - Posh Potato Salad

Ingredients

9oz small new potatoes, 3oz green beans, 4 salad onions diagonally sliced, 4oz pitted black olives, 2oz thinly sliced salami cut into quarters.

For Dressing 3 tblps olive oil, 1 tbsp white wine vinegar,1 tbsp fresh chopped mint, 2 tblsp grainy mustard, salt and pepper.



Cook potatoes in pan of boiling water add some salt and boil for 15 mins then add the beans and cook for further 3mins until tender but still crisp. Cool under running cold water then drain and leave to cool. When potatoes have cooled cut into chunks in a serving bowl with the salad onions, and salami and olives. To make dressing mix the olive oil, vinegar, mint and mustard. season to taste and then pour over the potato and lightly toss together. Divide into two serving plates and serve.

There have been letters in the Daily Telegraph about how people hate fresh sprouts and only eat them at Christmas, I was amazed sprouts are lovely to eat when they are in season. Small ones are the best, all you do is cut the bottom where the stem has been and peel of the outer leaves. At the bottom where the stem has been cut in with your knife a cross then put in a pan of water and bring to the boil and cook until tender drain and enjoy - remember fresh veg is so good for you.
